children. Over 80 players participated and played in a strong competition. The finals were decided in a penalty shootout. The soccer training is part of our Community Development program in which we support the people of Mineros de San Juan in building up a strong community. Every weekend we offer a variety of programs adjusted to the preferences and skills.
