Opening Day

In the first week of February our new school year started. The children



were welcomed at the school and the kindergarten. On the first day, a ceremony was held in front of the building as you can see it in the picture. Annual Check

Early February was the time for the annual health check. This is a regular and compulsory check for all children enrolled in kindergarten, performed at the health



centre. Nurses record weight and height, and doctors investigate for possible diseases. Each child is given vitamins and antiparisite medication, as well as vaccinations. With this standard screening in place, we ensure medical treatment and the best chance for illness prevention for all children.

Provecto Horizonte "on air"

Proyecto Horizonte gets its weekly TV presence! Cochabamba's TV-station "Canal 21" spent the day filming all the areas of the organization, including staff, volunteers, students and women from Tantakuna. By presenting our work over the next weeks in the program called "Emprendedores

that their children can safely learn and play every day.
