Here are some examples of our activities of the past weeks!

Women's Soccer Championship

We organized a soccer championship for educators, other personnel, and local mothers to promote integration and build



relationships within the community. Eight teams of 5 women each participated. During the first round the mothers of our youngest kids defeated "Projecto Horizonte" 5-2. Soccer is a sport that is intensely practiced in rural Bolivia. The women are very active and love to play or support their favorite team. The finals will be held in November.

Young Leaders Conference

José Luis Condori (15), a student of our school was recently invited by the Creative Artist Center to represent Cochabamba at the National Youth Leaders Conference in La Paz. More than 500 youths from institutes and schools from all over the country (Bolivia) attended and received classes in music, dance, theatre, and cinema. José Luis stated that "It was a unique experience. Opportunities like this don't exist very often. The most important thing for me was sharing it with kind and respectful people. It was an amazing experience that I will never forget."

Café "Projecto Horizonte"

Bolivia remembers the deceased during "All Saints". According to the Andean tradition, the souls arrive at noon on November 1 and walk until noon on November 2. The belief and Andean customs include a series of rituals that are manifested in religious superstitions: assembling a table full of small sweet cakes accompanied by small horse, bird, and other animal figurines with which the deceased were close to in life. In addition, the food and drinks that they liked the most are included. Students remembered the friends and neighbors that left us.
